Cover Clayton Schilg—Lifesaving at its Best

At approximately 2pm on 9 January 2020, Clayton Schilg and his friend Harry went down to Wooyung Beach for a swim. They were only down there for 5-10 minutes when Clayton noticed six people being pulled out in a rip. Clayton had been swimming and body boarding at Wooyung for nearly two weeks and knew they would need to be strong swimmers not to be in big trouble.

Only a minute later Clayton heard them shouting for help. Witness Stephen Watson said he saw Clayton immediately run up the beach to grab an old blue foam surfboard Stephen himself had found washed up on the beach some six months ago. Stephen had written for "emergency use only" on the board and it had been used in a few rescues since.

Clayton grabbed the board and ran back to the water and yelled to Harry to use his mobile phone to ring his Dad and to get assistance. About 30 metres out Clayton passed two of the swimmers that had managed to get back onto the sandbank and were making their way independently back in. They said they were ok so Clayton paddled on.

Clayton saw the second group out past the second sand bar, they were now screaming for help, so he paddled out another 30 to 40 metres to them.

The four swimmers were all spaced within a 10 metre radius. Clayton went to the swimmer who looked to be the most in trouble, Ben Jeffery. Ben has since explained that he was just about to give up. He had taken on a lot of water and was struggling to get any air. Ben grabbed the board and Clayton yelled out to the others to swim the five or so metres to him.

Things turned bad when one of the first swimmers to get to Clayton grabbed him in complete panic and started climbing up Clayton to get some relief. Clayton's training kicked in and he used the techniques taught in his SRC Course to get free.

Clayton helped Ben onto the board and told the others to hang on to the board. There wasn't enough room so Clayton got one of the swimmers, Ben's brother, to hang on to his waist.

Clayton called for everyone to kick but they couldn't, they were all completely spent. While hanging onto the front of the board and Ben, Clayton started to kick towards the shore. It took about one to two minutes to get to the outer sand bank and Ben's brother let go and made his way in. Clayton and the other three swimmers couldn't stand up as the sand kept shifting.

Clayton had to start kicking again, heading for the shore. The others still couldn't help. In the wave zone, Clayton kept the three swimmers together on the board through a few dumping waves knowing that if he couldn't control the nose of the board they would all flip, roll or nose dive.

Clayton moved the board into the gutter but was still about 30 metres out and still in fast moving water. He managed to ride on the back of a few waves moving as much as he could to the side of the rip. He kept kicking and talking to the guys on the board letting them know they were going to be alright. Finally they got to about chest deep water when another person came out and helped Clayton pull in the board.

Clayton got Ben to the high water mark and put him in the recovery position while someone called for an ambulance, Another man came over and mentioned that he had his bronze and helped Clayton monitor Ben until a registered nurse came to help.

Ben was taken to Tweed Heads Hospital where he stayed for almost a week while the doctors sorted all the issues that had developed from the amount of water that Ben had swallowed.

Witness, Stephen, contacted the club, stating he was amazed that Clayton took complete control, didn't panic and knew what to do every step of the way, not only in the water but on the beach as well. Stephen believes that without Clayton's actions, lives would have been lost.

While this rescue would be outstanding for an experienced lifesaver, it is astonishing that Clayton, 14 at the time of the rescue had only joined TH&C and gained his Surf Rescue Certificate in 2018 travelling down to the club on weekends from Brisbane.

Clayton, a very humble hero, gave credit to the Club for giving him lifesaving skills when he completed his Surf Rescue Certificate and did rescue scenarios. Our trainers are all volunteers and spend countless hours teaching lifesaving skills to our members.

Congratulations to Clayton, his family and also to Chief Training Officer Rob Walters and his trainers!

NOTICE OF ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

Notice is hereby given of the 109th Annual General Meeting of Tweed Heads and Coolangatta Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated.

8.30am onwards for registration, membership renewal and annual report collection)

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

An Annual General Meeting of the Association shall be held in accordance with the provisions of the Act and on a date no later than two calendar months from the end of the financial year and at a venue to be determined by the Board.

NOTICE OF GENERAL MEETING

- (a) Notice of every General Meeting shall be given to every Member entitled to receive notice, at the address appearing in the Register kept by the Association. The auditor and Directors shall also be entitled to notice of every General Meeting, which shall be sent to their last notified address. No other person shall be entitled as of right to receive notices of General Meetings.
- (b) Preliminary notice of a General Meeting should be issued 42 calendar days prior to the date of the meeting calling for notices of motion and any other business to be conducted at that meeting.
- (c) A notice of a General Meeting shall specify the place and day and hour of meeting and shall state the business to be transacted at the meeting.
- (d) At least 14 calendar days' notice of a General Meeting shall be given to those Members entitled to receive notice, together with:
- (i) the agenda for the meeting; and
- (ii) any notice of motion received from Members

BUSINESS

- (a) The business to be transacted at the Annual General Meeting must include;
 - (i) recording of Attendance and Apologies;
 - (ii) confirmation of previous Annual Meeting Minutes;
 - (ii) presentation of the Annual Report of the Board;
 - (ii) presentation of the financial statement and audit report for the last financial year;
 - (iii) the election of Directors under this Constitution,
 - (iv) the motion for affiliation with the Branch, SLSQ and SLSA;
 - (v) the motion recognising the affiliation of the Association's supporters club;
 - (vi) the appointment of the auditors for the present financial year; and
 - (iv) general business without notice of the Association.

- (b) All business that is transacted at a General Meeting, and also all that is transacted at an Annual General Meeting, with the exception of those matters set down in clause 20(a) shall be special business.
- (c) No business other than that provided on the notice shall be transacted at that meeting.

NOTICES OF MOTION

Members shall be entitled to submit notices of motion for inclusion as Special Business at a General Meeting. All notices of motion must be submitted in writing to the Secretary not less than 21 calendar days (excluding receiving date and meeting date) prior to the General Meeting. Notices of motion must include a mover and seconder.

Only Members eligible to vote shall be entitled to submit notices of motion for inclusion as Special Business at a General Meeting.

VOTING AT GENERAL MEETINGS

Members entitled to Vote

Each Member over the age of 15 years and entitled to vote as set out in **clause 11.1** shall have one vote at General Meetings which, subject to this Constitution, shall be exercised by that Member.

As per Section 11, Clause 11.1, Members, pages 11 to 13 of the Constitution:

Active, Reserve Active, Long Service, Past Active and Life Members have the right to be present, to debate and to vote at General meetings.

Probationary, Junior Activities (Nippers), Cadet and Honorary Members shall not have voting rights.

Associate, Award and Associate Junior Activities Parent Members shall not have voting rights unless elected to office or position, which is provided with voting rights by this constitution.

Casting Vote

Where voting at General Meetings is equal, the chairman may exercise a casting vote.

SUBSCRIPTIONS AND FEES

As per Constitution Section 11 Clause 12 page 13

The annual membership subscription (if any) and fees payable by Members to the Association, the time for and manner of payment shall be determined by the Board from time to time.

Such annual membership fees are payable for the ensuing season to be eligible to stand for office and vote at the Annual General Meeting.

QUORUM

No business shall be transacted at any General Meeting unless a quorum is present at the time when the meeting proceeds to business. A quorum for General Meetings shall be 30 Voting Members over the age of 15 years. A quorum for Special General Meetings shall be 50 Voting Members over the age of 15 years of age or 20% of the Voting Members whichever is the greater.

PROXY'S

Proxy voting shall not be permitted at any General Meeting.

If we all cast our mind back to the last off season our members were handed the highest accolade possible in being named Qld and Australian Surf Lifesaving Club of the Year for 2019. This was a true reflection of the work that has been done by our members for over 100 years now.

Since then our membership stayed pretty well in line with the previous season. Total membership 863 down from 890 Nipper Membership 321 down from 343 Active membership 217 up from 215

These Active Patrolling members have again ensured that our core goal of keeping our flagged area fatality free has been maintained. Thanks again to all of our members whom have volunteered their time this year. Thanks also to our training team who by February had already added 30 bronzies and 29 SRC qualifications to our team.

We can all be proud of the work done by our training team as they and member Clayton Schilg were both recognised by SLS NSW for the work done by Clayton in January whilst on holidays at Wooyung Beach rescuing 4 members of the public. Clayton (14) has been awarded the rescue of the month for NSW and the training team have been congratulated for their involvement in his training. Well done on behalf of the club.

Well done also to all of the kids who participated in Nippers this year, I hope fun was had on Nipper Sundays. The Nipper season was unfortunately cut short and the state carnival cancelled for the year. This was particularly frustrating as we had our kids firing and were hopeful of some great results.

Thanks to all of our coaching staff for their involvement again this year. Jason Barker, Callum Taylor, Kane Hayley and Mariah Jones.

Thanks also to all of the volunteers who gave up their time to ensure that our kids had as much fun as possible. Congratulations to Vaughn and his team for another great season and thanks to Vaughn who is hanging up the pink shirt after 8 seasons as Nipper President. Well done and thanks on behalf of the club. Our Youth have also been busy with regular events throughout the year and we have been really successful with our retention rates of these kids. Thanks to Sam O'Rourke for her work in this area.

Our senior competitors were also robbed of their end of season carnivals with State, Aussies and Worlds all cancelled. Despite this we still managed some highlights.

Our masters pool rescue team defended their Australian Pool Rescue title winning this title for a second year in a row.

Congratulations to Mariah Jones, Leah Jones and Chantal Luxton who all went on to represent Australia at different carnivals in pool rescue.

We also hosted the Point Danger Branch carnival this year and it was such a success that they have booked again for next year. Thanks to all of those who helped out.

Congratulations also to our board riders who after protests and recounts were finally handed the trophy for the Branch Surfing titles. Well done to all involved.

We have also been very busy off the beach. We have now transitioned to a Gold Coast City Council lease which helped us to secure the land at the rear of the club.

Our building committee has had a busy time on a number of projects including the beautification of the rear of the club, the construction of the new storage shed and most currently the renovations of the male change rooms.

We are going to start next season with some much improved facilities thanks to the work of Dave Peate and Craig Hickling.

The project at the rear of the club has been able to be completed thanks to a grant for \$107k from Sport Australia and the remainder has been done through cash flow without any additional borrowings. Thanks very much to Marty and the team from the Greenmount Surf Club our Supporters Club for again supporting our club and helping us to finance some of these projects.

We have also been able to source the following equipment this year through other grants sourced by the club that we hope will all be ready for the new season.


- New tractor ordered ready for delivery for next season

Although the surf sports season was cut short, I would like to acknowledge all the time and effort put in by our coaches and competitors. Thank you to the grant writing department at SLSQ for their assistance with a grant application for a new tractor. The application was successful with the tractor due to arrive early June.

Once again the Federal Beach Safety Equipment Fund was used to purchase a new IRB motor. This enables us to turn over our motors regularly.

We were really fortunate to receive these grants this year as funding will be harder to get in the future due to the Covid 19.

I would like to thank all the patrol members for their efforts throughout the season on keeping our beach fatality free and safe for the public.

Special mentions to Dean Iwanuscha and Chris Van Doorn who covered for our Brisbane members who could not make their patrols due to travel restrictions.

I would like to personally thank Kerrie Barnes from Point Danger Branch for all her assistance and patience over the last 20 years and wish her all the best for the future in her new role at SLSQ.

DIRECTOR OF SURF LIFESAVING'S REPORT

Season 2019/2020 commenced with TH&C SLSC named as the SLSQ Point Danger Branch, SLSQ and SLSA Club of the Year for the 2018/2019 season. This is testament to the continued good management of the Club and the positive direction that the Club is heading futuristically. At the conclusion of the season we had 218 Active Members (Cadet, Junior and Senior). This was a decrease of 0.45% (1 member) on season 2018/2019. We also had members in the Active Reserve, Award and Long Service category assisting with patrols throughout the season.

On behalf of the Club I would like to express thanks to all the members who contributed to patrols throughout the season regardless if a member completed 1 hour or 100, every volunteer hour was appreciated. We would like to particularly note those who volunteered on public holiday patrols.

Congratulations are extended to Clayton Schilg – a cadet member who performed an outstanding rescue in the Christmas school holidays. It is pleasing to see that the skills that our members – both young and old learn are being used to save lives. Thanks to the training team – Rob, Debbie, Daren, Chris and Rod for their efforts in training our members to be ready to respond to emergency situations.

Throughout the season a number of members gained new awards 33 Bronze Medallion, 7 ART, 14 First Aid, 14 IRB Crewperson, 32 Radio Operators, 17 CPR and 3 Beach Management. Patrols were kept busy this season with 68 909 beach visitations, 37 first aid cases, 240 marine stings. Coupled with 74 preventative actions and warning 1622 people. We also performed 4 rescues throughout the season (1 in October, 2 in December and 1 in March). There were some changes to patrols at the latter half of the season due to the Covid-19 Pandemic. This created some challenges for the Club due to some roster changes and the closure of our beach to the general public. The patrol members adapted to this change well, maintaining a surveillance patrol throughout this time.


This season we were also successful in gaining grants towards the provision of equipment for the patrols including \$3000 from QFES/SLSQ Sustainability that we used to buy additional uniforms, loud hailers, binoculars, tourniquet kits.

Beach Safety Equipment Fund - provided money to purchase and IRB motor .

Gambling Community Benefit Funds – provided funds to purchase a tractor.

Thank you to the leadership of the board of management for a successful season at TH&C and thank you for the opportunity to represent the club in this role.



BUILDING COMMITTEE REPORT

We are finally starting to see some light at the end of the tunnel with the work at the back of the club.

At the time of submitting this report the concrete pavement has been constructed which leaves the following items still to be completed:

- Fencing panels and gates
- Geotechnical permeable paving system
- Electrical and plumbing fitout
- Landscaping

The project has taken a lot longer to complete than originally planned– some of this can be attributed to the current coronavirus pandemic and also to errors and delays caused by one particular contractor. The club is very fortunate to have engaged Billy Preston as our builder. He has accommodated all the delays within his busy program and has been great to work with – obviously putting the interests of the club first.

A big thankyou also needs to go to Craig Hickling who has committed a lot of his time to the work. His knowledge and skills in the building trade have not gone to waste.

Once again the Old Boys are providing tremendous support by committing to the construction of the paving and landscaping. The Old Boys have agreed to fund the landscaping works which represents a big saving to the surf club. I have already been asked why the concrete paving does not extend to the shed and is not the width of at least the double gates. The reason for this is that impervious paving cannot be installed within the tree protection zone of the closest fig tree (a condition of the DA which must be complied with). However the permeable paving system can carry very heavy loads so it should do the trick.

Whilst the closure of the Supporters Club has done very little for our cashflow it has given the Building Committee the opportunity to undertake many projects that would have been difficult whilst the club was in operation. These have included:


- Roof flashing repairs

The 2019/2020 season has certainly been one to remember! The season started with a bang. TH&C SLSC awarded the Point Danger Branch, Queensland, and Australian SLS club of the year. What an incredible achievement for all members and supporters involved. This momentum continued in the sporting arena for our athletes throughout the shortened season.

Although it was disappointing but necessary for the 2020 State and Aussie Titles to be cancelled, our club still has many sports highlights from the past 12 months to reflect on. These top achievements include world record performances by Lisa Ferguson in the 35-39 Women 100m Manikin Carry w Fins, Ruth Kemp in the 70+ Women 100m Manikin Tow, and Adam Moore in the 40-44 Men 100m Manikin Tow w Fins at the Australian Pool Rescue Championships. The masters pool team took out the overall point score for the second year in a row at the Australian Pool Rescue Championships. TH&C also won the overall point score winners at the Gold Coast board riding championships. Our Nippers placed 3rd overall at the Point Danger Branch Youth Championships, and 6th overall after three rounds of the Queensland Beach Series. These are some outstanding successes that we look to build on for the year ahead.

TH&C had 12 athletes selected into various representative teams throughout the season, this is the most we have had for several years. Lily Alford. Izzy Boucher, Cimarron Crawford. Michaela Evans, Jazmin Graham and Jacob Sands attended the QLD interbranch championships as part of the Point Danger Branch team. Leah Jones and Chantal Luxton were selected in the Australian Development Team to compete at the Commonwealth Lifesaving Championships in the UK, while Mariah Jones was again selected in the Australian Lifesaving Team to contest the German Gup/Orange Cup. Congratulations again to all these members on their achievements.

In February, our club successfully hosted the PDB senior champs. It was a great carnival, the beach events were held in the evening under lights providing a great atmosphere, followed by perfect conditions at Greenmount the next day for the water events. We managed to have over 60 of our own members compete that weekend. Plenty of laughs were had, great team spirit and good racing. NIPPER REPORT

Season Overview

The 53rd season is complete with some brilliant statistics. These highlights cannot be diminished, even though the impact of COVID-19 brought a disappointing end to an otherwise stellar season:

- The club had 349 nippers registered, and 18 of these were under 15's (up from 10 the prior season).
- Maintained the high nipper registrations from previous season. TH&C remained the largest in the Point Danger Branch (PDB). Over the past eight (8) seasons, nipper numbers were:

- 290 age awards allocated
- 32 (new) SRC awards allocated
- 79 of 220 Patrolling members are either u15 nippers or their parents and siblings
- \$80,000 nipper budget
- 4th overall in PDB for u11-15's, 3rd overall in PDB for u8-10's.
- 7th overall in GCCT for u11-15's, 3rd overall in PDB for u8-10's.

Every week our nippers accumulate points for attendance at nippers, at carnivals, racing in our two club champs and helping with surf safe appeal.


Avalon Haley from under 11's is the Club Champion, and last won this award two seasons ago as an u9.



Total Revenue YTD was \$3.24 million with a Gross Profit of \$2.2 million equating to 69% of sales and an Operating Profit of \$505k


Donations to the Surf Club YTD is \$460k

TREASURER'S REPORT

The Surf Club has made a profit of over \$429,000 as per our attached audited accounts a sizeable increase of last years \$342,000. Donations from the Supporters Club totalled \$533,600 as compared with \$536,400 last year. The effects of the Covid 19 virus only affected us late in our financial year which ended on the 30th of April 2020, when due to the shutdown of the Supporters Club we did not get a donation for April from them. We had budgeted for approximately \$1 million in operational and donation income for the year just ended and we came very close to this budget and would have achieved this if not the Covid 19 virus shut down of the Supporters Club.

Our available cash funds are limited, as the amounts in the Building Accounts are committed to final payments to be made for the completion of the new shed. Our forward budgets have projected reduced donations from the Supporters Club commencing in July but not returning to those of normal trading until January of 2021. We will manage with these current available funds through some negative months with the support of both the Federal Government's Cash Boost and Job Keeper. Although this next year has been forecasted to be very lean where we will have to be careful with expenditure, we are still in a very good position compared to most clubs.

I again would like to remind members that when they see our net profit of \$429,000 that this figure contains all grant monies received that will have to be, to be acquitted spent on capital items where they go straight to the balance sheet as an asset (ie they are not expensed in the profit and loss). The result of this is the net profit does not amount to available funds as the profit has already been spent on these Capital items as directed by the applicable grant or our own contribution towards these improvements.

We have not as yet had to avail ourselves of any deferred loan repayments on our Westpac Loan and we are hoping not to call upon any such assistance. Consequently, our Westpac Loan has been reduced to \$468,791 at the end of the April 2020 Financial Year from the previous year balance of \$590,399 a very good result which could have been even better if not for Covid 19.

Income from Fund Raising as the attached financials show still represents a large part of our budget and it will with the current circumstances become even more crucial to our overall operational budge. I therefore would like to thank all of those involved in these activities and especially the Old Boys who keep putting their hands up to man these fund raisers.

The 2 Helens continue to make my job easy with all the work they do and I would like to thank them for their efforts as without the contribution I do not think I would be able to under-take my role as Treasurer.






Successful Grants

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2020

The financial statements cover the business of Tweed Heads & Coolangatta SLSC Inc and have been prepared to meet the needs of stakeholders and to assist in the preparation of the tax return.

Comparatives are consistent with prior years, unless otherwise stated.

1 Basis of Preparation

The Company is non reporting since there are unlikely to be any users who would rely on the general purpose financial statements.

The special purpose financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the significant accounting policies described below and do not comply with any Australian Accounting Standards unless otherwise stated.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities.

Significant accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are presented below and are consistent with prior reporting periods unless otherwise stated.

2 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost of inventory is determined using the first-in-first-out basis and is net of any rebates and discounts received. Net realisable value is estimated using the most reliable evidence available at the reporting.

Property, Plant and Equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment.

Depreciation

Property, plant and equipment excluding freehold land, is depreciated on a straight line basis over the assets useful life to the company, commencing when the asset is ready for use.

Impairment of Non-Financial Assets

At the end of each reporting period the company determines whether there is an evidence of an impairment indicator for non-financial assets.

Where this indicator exists and regardless for goodwill, indefinite life intangible assets and intangible assets not yet available for use, the recoverable amount of the assets is estimated.

Where assets do not operate independently of other assets, the recoverable amount of the relevant cash-generating unit (CGU) is estimated.

The recoverable amount of an asset or CGU is the higher of the fair value less costs of disposal and the value in use. Value in use is the present value of the future cash flows expected to be derived from an asset or cash-generating unit.

Where the recoverable amount is less than the carrying amount, an impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss.

Reversal indicators are considered in subsequent periods for all assets which have suffered an impairment loss, except for goodwill.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprises cash on hand, demand deposits and short-term investments which are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is recognised when the business is entitled to it.

Rental income

Investment property revenue is recognised on a straight-line basis over the period of the lease term so as to reflect a constant periodic rate of return on the net investment.

Interest revenue

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method.

Dividend revenue

Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established.

Rendering of services

Revenue in relation to rendering of services is recognised depends on whether the outcome of the services can be measured reliably. If this is the case then the stage of completion of the services is used to determine the appropriate level of revenue to be recognised in the period. If the outcome cannot be reliably measured then revenue is recognised to the extent of expenses recognised that are recoverable.

Other income

Other income is recognised on an accruals basis when the company is entitled to it.

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenue, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of GST.
