# FROM THE IRB AND TRAINING ROOMS

Hello everyone and welcome once again to the Grapevine.

While it has been great to see the rain, it has created some very trying times for our Patrol Members, making some days very miserable. Thanks to everyone (that could) for showing up under these conditions.

It can be a bit expensive turning up for Patrol though. While driving down to one of my recent Patrols (Tweed area received 190 ml of rain that morning) a lot of water was across many sections of the road. One of the puddles I hit was particularly large, with water spraying up over the roof of the car. Still made it though and completed my Patrol.

Upon returning home that afternoon it was discovered that my front number plate had been torn off by the water, location unknown. Long story short, you cannot get one number plate replaced, you have to get two new plates with different registration numbers - \$140.00 later and a few phone calls to change rego details I was back on the road.

Needless to say I have now attached the plates with much larger bolts in the hope that this will not repeat itself. Will probably tear the bumper off next. First time it has ever happened to me. That's life.

We had a Bronze/SRC course planned to commence on the 16th February, however due to lack of numbers the course was postponed. We will be setting another date shortly. The scheduled IRB Driver/Crew course scheduled to begin on the 14/3/20 is still going ahead at this stage with four prospects. There is plenty of room for some more candidates so if anyone is interested please register as the office. It will be a fun course. Dates are 14/3/20 then every Saturday and Sunday until assessment day on the 12/4/20.

We will be rescheduling a Tractor/SSV course shortly also and will let you know when this will happen.

Our vice CTO, Daren Healey, has been forced to retire from training duties for the time being due to health problems. He will be dearly missed. Get well soon Papa Smurf and thanks for everything you have done for us.

## IRB STUFF.

All four IRB,s are fully functional as are all four Outboards. The faulty kill switch has now been replaced on outboard No1, the original switch rusted near solid. We were able to source replacement switches at J Car at South Tweed Heads and guess what?, they are exactly the same as the original units fitted to the new Mercury Motors, cheap Chinese rubbish. Anyway, I purchased 3 units and so have two spare units on hand for the next switch failure. Should drivers/crew notice any malfunction with the switches please let me or the office know as it is an easy fix and we have the parts.

A new can of WD40 has been placed in the Patrol Shed so please use it on the motors after you wash them down at the end of Patrol. Also could drivers and crew please flag and withdraw from service any damaged PPE equipment, Life Jackets or Helmets. We have some replacement units for these.

On the subject of helmets I would like to draw your attention to the Club Policy regarding their use. Three or so years ago the Club made a decision that all IRB Drivers and Crew were to wear Helmets - mandatory wearing policy, as decided by the BOM. This was a pro-active decision, so as to provide our Patrolling Members with best practice protective equipment when operating the IRB.

To this end the Club purchased quantities of "GAF" helmets, arguably the best quality helmet for water based activities, at considerable cost and members were advised as to their responsibility in their use.

The helmets were widely accepted by Driver and Crew and have been receiving considerable use.

Just to explain where this fits into WHS (Workplace Health and Safety) legislation, under the WHS Law, Section 19, The employer (Our Club) has a primary responsibility (duty of care) towards its workers (us). Workers have duty to take care of their own health and safety and that of others who may be affected by their actions at work (Patrol etc). Workers must co-operate, under WHS legislation, with everyone to meet their legal requirements.



Just to summarise this, the Club has practiced primary responsibility by providing IRB Drivers and Crew with protective headware for use in the driving and crewing of the powercraft. The club has instructed Drivers/ Crew to wear the head protection as part of their duty of care to you. Driver and Crew responsibility is to wear this protective headwear provided to them. This is the legislation under the ACT.

It has been good to see some Drivers taking out the newly qualified crewies for a run during Patrol. Please continue this action as helps develop their skills should an emergency arise.

That's about it for this report, Helen is chasing me to get it in.

<b>Title:</b>	Reminder – Member Safety and Compliance
<b>Document ID:</b>	18.01.2020
<b>Department:</b>	Club Services
<b>Audience:</b>	All SLSQ Clubs & Branches; SLSQ Officers & State Advisors; Committee & Panel Members; All Branch Directors; All SLSQ Staff;
<b>Summary:</b>	Reminder for clubs and members to ensure appropriate qualifications are met prior to patrolling, operating equipment or training/competing in surf lifesaving sports.
<b>Date:</b>	31 January 2020

### SUMMARY

There have been incidents occur over the past few weeks that have highlighted the need to remind Clubs and members to ensure that they have the appropriate awards and training to operate lifesaving operational equipment – including powercraft. Members that do not hold appropriate awards, or that are non-financial, pose a significant risk to the organisation and the overall safety of our members and also the bathing public.

**Any member who is not proficient (Dec 31 for currently proficient members), not financial (as at Sept 30), or who has not completed the appropriate award, shall not be allowed to perform patrols; operate rescue craft and/or train/compete in surf lifesaving competitions.**

To ensure appropriate member safety, and to minimise organisational risk, Clubs are reminded of the following points from the Patrol Operations Manual:

### SURF RESCUE VEHICLE OPERATIONS

Surf Rescue Vehicles shall be driven by qualified personnel, approved by the club and/or patrol captain. All operators should receive an induction prior to operating any motorised vehicle. Patrol members shall have a sound knowledge of the basic lifesaving equipment that the vehicle carries and where the equipment is stored. Local council ordinances on beach operations shall always be observed, particularly with regard to speed limit and the coastal dune areas.

#### • **DRIVER QUALIFICATIONS FOR SSV, 4WD AND TRACTOR OPERATIONS:**

- Operators shall be 17 years of age and shall:
- Hold a driver's license – provisional or open (for provisional license holders 'P' plates must be displayed as per Queensland Transport Regulations);
- Be a financial member of an affiliated Surf Life Saving Club;
- Be a proficient SLSA award holder; and
- Have completed an SLSA -SSV, 4WD and Tractor induction.

### IRB OPERATIONS

All Clubs are responsible for operating within the Queensland Transport Guidelines and Regulations, Surf Life Saving Queensland Policies, Powercraft Code of Conduct and other relevant procedures. Failure to do so can jeopardise marine safety, therefore causing injury or death and may result in the operator/club being liable to criminal prosecution and civil litigation. Breaches to the Powercraft Code of Conduct, SLSQ's Powercraft Safety Management System or SLSQ Policies/Procedures will result in a full investigation of the incident or injury as per the SLSQ Powercraft Incident and Investigation Guidelines.

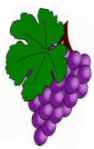

TH&C u11-14's finished a super close 4<sup>th</sup> place (176 points) behind Tallebudgera 3<sup>rd</sup> (192 points), with Tugun 2<sup>nd</sup> (496 points) and Currumbin 1<sup>st</sup> (563 points) being the dominant clubs this time. There were tough weather conditions, resulting in the carnival being split over two weekends – Saturday 8<sup>th</sup> Feb for the sand events and Sunday 23<sup>rd</sup> Feb for the water events. This was a blessing and a curse at the same time! Some parents enjoyed the chance to watch all the individual sprints and team beach relays one after the other on the first Saturday, which is an unusual opportunity. The TH&C relay teams were ever present in most age groups in the top 1-4, with our all-age A and B teams achieving the remarkable by placing 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> respectively, following a detailed official review! Out of 8 beach relays for u11-14 male and female, TH&C placed 1<sup>st</sup> in 6 of these races. Congratulations to all the nippers were able to execute well with the baton!

A memorable flag finals for the u12 girls saw Indi Crawford, Addie Free AND Leah Herangi go 1,2,3 – which was really something to cheer about in the pouring rain! We are used to watching the u13 girls smother the finals field in flags, and to now see u12 girls do the same thing was really special.

Our under 11's performed really well with some help from our friends from the under 10's Nippers - Nicholas Pearce, Jesse Wellman, Sooke Paley, Molly Rogers and Lily-Anne Gould, who embraced the opportunity to the race, with the encouragement and support of their families. The kids put their full effort and abilities into both days with some commendable results. Congratulations to all of our Nippers for their persistence, comradery and sportsmanship.

With a focus on fine tuning the board rescue technique at training, we had some great results in this event with combinations making finals, including Lily Alford and Kaelani Sherwood (team C) in u13 girls placing 7<sup>th</sup>, Brock Osborne and Blaise Telford (team C) in u12 placing 6<sup>th</sup>, Molly Rogers and Sooke Paley (as u10's) (team B) in u11 placing 6<sup>th</sup> and Nick Pearce and Jesse Wellman (team B) in u11 placing 7<sup>th</sup>.

Another outstanding result in the water was the u12 boys win in the surf teams.

Thank you to our officials – including Rod Jones our club Vice President (water sectional referee), Vaughn Thomas (Chief Judge), Steph Osborne (Chief Marshall), Shane Bisgrove (ARRO) and Brad Holdway, Amanda McClure, Anne Larard, Benn Pinkerton, Craig Sherwood and Rae Lohse (Judges). Without their help we could not enter the kids.







## BEING AN OFFICIAL

Here's a couple of comments on the experience of being an official at a carnival. The off-season is an ideal time to undertake a course to help the club be prepared for the beginning of season 2020-21. We can plan with confidence knowing there is a pool of volunteers ready to assist, and it helps alleviate burn-out of some of our existing officials, some of whom have multiple roles in the club. Remember, the first team's carnival of next season is the u8-10's teams at Pacific SLSC, and this creeps up on us faster than you think!

*"I performed my first official duty on Sunday 23rd Feb at branch. As a nipper mum, it was a great experience to see how much effort our volunteers do behind the scenes to make it all happen. Also seeing up close the excitement of many nippers who compete for each of their clubs. I encourage anyone to take a role in something, to continue to make our nippers sport even more amazing."*

*"I was somewhat reluctant to take on a role with Nippers, I usually end up being on most committees for the activities my kids are involved in, but sometimes you just need to be a parent. Then of course Vaughn stands up at the meeting and tells everyone that the Club needs everyone to pitch in. Honestly, I looked for the least time consuming role I could find. Officials. Do a short course, turn up to 3-4 events a season my daughter was going to be at anyway. Perfect job to be involved, but not too involved."*

*It has been a really enjoyable role, I have done three carnivals, moved from probation to being an official and I felt like I was helping the Club without having to commit to something every weekend, like being an age manager (thank you to Sharon, my daughter's age manager) or being on the wider Committee.*

*I have felt really supported in learning the role from both the Club and Branch and I expect it will be something I will continue when my daughter decides she has had enough of Nippers. A couple of weekends a summer to help your club, get a few beers and a feed afterwards. It is not a bad way to support Surf Life Saving".* – **Simon McKinley**, dad of Ivy u9's.

*"I've found supporting the club and my daughter by becoming an official is a great way to get involved. You don't need any specific skill, there are many ways an official can contribute. Your preferences for beach or water areas are always considered. Over the years I have been many roles. As the name suggests, a recorder records results - It does require some attention to detail and can be quite fast paced. It is also a great way to interact with all the kids and some of them are so excited about their results and accomplishments. It's lovely to be a part of that."*

*Judging can vary between events but there are some things all events have in common. You will have other judges to support you and often iPads record races for verification. All you have to do is pay close attention to the important things such as competitor change overs in relay events and the order competitors finish. If marshalling is your thing, don't be shy, a loud voice helps and give the kids clear direction. Whatever official role you choose, you're supporting your kids, your club and surf lifesaving. You'll find you get a greater understanding of carnival competition. All officials are keen to support you and share their knowledge and you get to know other club members a little better".* – **Leonie Eriksen**, mum of Caillie u13's.
