## FROM THE PRESIDENT

Hi Members,

Happy New Year to you all and here's hoping for a successful one for us all. If you are like me and need to get some training in Jason's sessions are up and running. I might see you there.

Well members we have a Hero within our ranks at the club. If you have not heard the story yet one of our young members Clayton Schilg whilst on holidays at Wooyung Beach has performed a rescue on four adults. Clayton was at the beach with a friend when he noticed 7 members of the public caught in a rip and taken off the sand bank. Whilst he sent his friend for help Clayton grabbed an old foam surfboard off the beach and didn't hesitate to go in to rescue these people. Clayton was able to return 4 adults to the beach whilst the remaining three people were able to get to shore. One of the men aged 28 was certainly in a bad way and says that he thinks he only had one more minute in him before he may have given up. This guy received treatment on the beach was taken away to hospital where he made a full recovery. On behalf of the club Clayton WELL DONE MATE we are all very proud of you.

There has been an outpouring from people who were present on the day or family of the patients to say that Clayton did not hesitate to put his own life at risk to save those in the water. They also have paid tribute to the fact that such a young man had enough confidence in the training that he has received to take this rescue despite being on his own. Well done to our training team it is nice to get feedback back that the work that you continue to do for our club is affecting people's lives.

I want to take this opportunity to again pass thanks to all of our patrolling members because these situations just ram home just what it means to volunteer your time to be a Surf Lifesaver.

Ok Carnival season is nearly upon us and we are hosting the Senior Point Danger branch carnival this year. It will be beach events under lights on the Friday night 28/2 and all water events on Saturday 29/2 for age groups under 15 through to masters. It is a great opportunity for us to showcase our club to all of the other ten clubs in our branch. It will be hard work though and we will require a substantial workforce in the following areas, Set Up and Pack up each day, First Aid staff throughout the carnival, Catering for the officials throughout the carnival and on completion each day. It will also offer us the opportunity to run a BBQ for the two days as well. Please if you are interested in helping in any way contact the office or myself so that we can start to piece it all together.

# FROM THE IRB AND TRAINING ROOMS



Hello to everyone and welcome to the first Grapevine of 2020. Hope everyone had a great Christmas and, those that can, are enjoying a happy holiday period.

The Training Team are preparing to get back into training again and have scheduled a Bronze Course, IRB Driver and Crew Course, SSV/Tractor course, Marine Licence Course (for those wishing to become IRB Drivers) and looking at arranging a First Aid course at our Club should we get the numbers.

The Marine Licence course is commencing at the beginning of February, please contact the Surf Club Office for details of this as it is delivered by a private provider outside of the Club and will need to be booked. The Surf Club Board of Management has agreed to pay for the Boat Licence training component of the course, provided that the candidate commit to a two year period of performing Patrols at Greenmount. It is up to the individual to pay for the actual licence and the Personal Water Craft (Jet Ski) component of the course should they wish too.

We have scheduled a Bronze/SRC course to commence Sunday 16/2/20, then every Sunday until assessment day on Sunday 5/4/20. Please register your interest with the Office so as we can organise the relevant resources. Course commences 8am Qld Time until 1PM Qld time.

We have scheduled a SSV/Tractor Course to be conducted right after the Bronze/SRC assessment on the 5/4/20. This will commence at 12 noon and will take approx 3 hours to complete. Once again, please book at the office.

An IRB Driver/Crew course has been scheduled to commence on Saturday 14/3/20, then every Saturday and Sunday until assessment day on Sunday 26/4/20. This is a good time to get this course through before it gets too cold.

Once again, please book at the office. Course starts 8am Qld time and finishes 1pm Qld time. Allowances have been built into the schedule for a day off occasionally, depending on the progress of the group. It is a fun course, the more the merrier.

With IRB training regulations stipulating that the "Patient" has to have an IRB Driver or Crew qualification, we sometimes have difficulty conducting full rescue scenarios on some days due to the unavailability of a qualified "Patient". To this end, and to give our resident Crash Test Dummy (Patient), Wazza a rest,

I have been looking into procuring a couple of Aquatic Rescue Manikins.

The manikins replicate the size and weight of an average size patient and are ideal for practicing patient pick ups and rescue scenarios in the absence of a live patient. They are quite expensive, however once again, the Old Boys Association have asked me to submit a quote to them for their consideration re the purchase of a dummy/dummies. This is being done as I write this.

And what about young Clayton Schilg Great job performed by this young man, successfully using the tools he earned by completing his Surf Rescue Certificate at TH and C. Cannot do much better than that.

Also, we would like to get expressions of interest by members who might like to attend a First Aid Certificate course conducted at our club. This course is conducted by SLSQ trainers and I can arrange a course to be conducted at our Club if we have sufficient numbers (at least 10). This course is Nationally recognised and can be used in a workplace. This course has to be upgraded every 3 years to remain current.

## IRB STUFF.

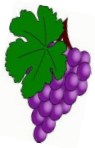
First up, someone (who will remain nameless) last Sunday tried to kill our newest Thundercat Generation 3 Irb. This from all reports happened when attempting to retrieve an anchor, which somehow flew through the air and punctured the bow tube of the boat resulting in instant deflation of the bow tube. This would have been an experience piloting the craft back to shore in the large surf that was running at the time.

The craft is now lying on the floor of the Training Room awaiting life saving surgery.

I am hoping to get down by the end of the week or early next week to operate on her and get her back up to speed nearly as good as new.

The Aurora, Achilles and Thundercat Generation 2 craft are all fully operational, as are three of the motors. One of the Mercuries has been tagged as having a faulty kill switch. Having checked this out it appears that it has rusted nearly solid and will not operate. This has been a problem with all the motors which come with the cheap Chinese kill switches installed, but it is an easy fix. I have located a source for switches at Jaycar South Tweed. They are no better than the ones that come with the motors, however they are cheap and easy to change so I will get a few and keep in stock.





Just a reminder to Patrol Captains and IRB Drivers, it is mandatory that the IRB be stationed at the waters edge at all times. This means that it will have to be moved several times throughout the day due to tidal changes. Do not leave it sitting high and dry when the tide recedes as this will make it difficult to launch in a hurry should an emergency occur. You will also loose points if your Patrol is inspected and the craft is not on the waters edge.

We recently had 9 new Crew members qualify before Christmas. They are keen and very good at what they do so Drivers please take them out when you can to maintain their training and skills.

That is about it for now, please book your spot if you are interested in any of the training programs scheduled and I will see you on the beach.

## YOUNG GUNS TEAMS WRAP – 12<sup>TH</sup> JAN 2020

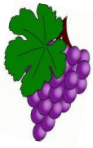

## **YOUTH DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM – 6-10<sup>TH</sup> JAN**

Well done to Harry Blaser (u15) and Isaac Rogers (u14) who represented TH&C in a five-day camp with 38 other youth from the Gold Coast. These lads got to experience many aspects of life saving operations at various clubs and venues, as explained by Harry below. Thanks to the club and SLSQ for providing this tremendous opportunity.

### **Day 1**

At TH&C we were split into two groups – a long board group and a learn to surf group and then we swapped. Morning tea was fruit and muffins and after a pizza lunch we had unlimited games at Time-zone.



### **Day 2**

At Mermaid Beach we experienced a session of learning the tips and tricks of resuscitation. Everyone trialled their resuscitation skills on dummies and were then tested to see who had the best resuscitation timing. Dangerous jellyfish such as the box jelly fish, Irukandji and blue bottles were discussed. After lunch a paramedic explained a fast and simple way to evaluate a patient's situation called IMIST (identification, Mechanism, Injuries, Signs, Treatments and trends). It was helpful to understand how to deliver information to the paramedics in simple and effective way. After an obstacle course and quick swim we went inside Surfcom, the central control point for communications – it was amazing with screens almost everywhere looking over the beaches and weather conditions.

### **Day 3**

The day started at Gold Coast Aquatic centre where we were taught the fundamentals of a mannequin rescue, a tube rescue and a line toss and reel. After everyone had a go learning we all participated in a relay to see who had the best and fastest rescue skills. Once everyone had finished, we were taught how to scan and evaluate a busy rescue scene consisting of many people pretending to drown as well as people who had lost children and pets. We were taught to first attend to patients who were conscious and drowning then the unconscious – it was important to understand which was a higher priority. The day finished at Southport to go for a swim.

### **Day 4**

At Broadbeach we listened to heads of nippers and water police, who explained their job and how it's made easier thanks to the help of hundreds of lifeguards every day. Police boats were often named after police that had died in action doing their job. They had 3 types of boats. They covered information on missing people, such as 1-6 year olds and how far they could wander off. We then got the chance to feel how heavy their vests were. After a swim, we had some beach games then got to experience the jet ski. Jack the driver made it fun and did not hesitate to put the pedal to the medal! He talked to us about Surfcom and the amazing types of jobs on offer and the requirements for working – including the helicopter, becoming an Australian life-guard, Surfcom and the roadrunners.

### **Day 5**

Tallebudgera was full of fun activities these consisted of raft building, giant swing, abseiling, rock climbing and canoeing. The groups were split up so unfortunately the groups only got to do two of the activities they were assigned to. Our group got to do raft building and the giant swing. Raft building was fun and used to help develop our minds to solve issues ourselves, the rafts were very good and floated on the water. Unfortunately, an all-out war between the boys and girls was the destruction of both rafts! Straight after lunch it was the giant swing everyone was extremely nervous, but we all managed to get to the top and feel a giant drop all the way back to the ground.

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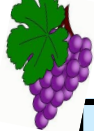
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
