FROM THE IRB AND TRAINING ROOMS



Hi Everyone,

Grapevine time again. This last month has flown again and we are starting to line up Christmas. Scary stuff.

It has been a very busy time for the Training Team. During the school holidays we conducted an intense one week Bronze and Surf Rescue Certificate training course 21 SRC candidates and 24 Bronze candidates. This was 5 more than last year and once again consisted of a cross section of mature age learners to junior learners, all keen as mustard to get going.

We put in 5 hours a day for 6 days to get this done and fortunately the weather was great with only one day blown out with a strong northerly wind. We just got out of the water in time for the bluebottles to come in.

Everyone pulled together during the course as we greatly encourage team work when training and by the third day candidates were beginning to show promise which developed into genuine skill by the assessment day.

We had fun playing with the electronic manakins. These manakins (six of them) monitor the chest compression rate and projects the results onto a big screen for all to see. Everyone starts off badly but by the time we finish their performance rate is an average of 95%.

On the third day our resident club Paramedic, Garth McMillan, gave the students a lesson in basic first aid, which is part of the course, and brought with him a flash drive with some pretty explicit incidents of injuries that have occurred to some people and how they are treated. Everyone enjoyed the session and it covered all of the points we needed to address. Many thanks to Garth for this.

Our training IT man, Chris Van Dorn has been tweaking our electronic presentation material and making it easier for us to present this material on the screen. Thanks for this Chris, good work.

We were sure glad that the TH and C Old boys purchased all of those high viz shirts and caps for us, we needed everyone of them during the course, the ocean was a sea of red during training.

The Old Boys have also agreed to the purchase of 6 new training Defibrillators and by the number of people we are training we really need them. The Old Boys do wonders for the Training Department and are always willing to help so thanks again to all you guys, it is much appreciated.

Once again, this intense course was very rewarding for both the trainer and the trainees and we were very proud as to how everyone polished up for the assessment. The assessor for the day was Dereck Baldwin from Tallebudgera Surf Club. Dereck has been awarded Assessor of the year for both the Branch and the State so we can be assured that our trainees were assessed thoroughly and fairly.

We have another Bronze/SRC course scheduled, this course starts on Sunday 27/10/19 then every Sunday morning until assessment day on the 8/12/19. Course commences at 8am Qld time and finishes at 12N Qld time so please register with the office if you would like to attend this course.

We also have an IRB Driver/Crew course scheduled to commence on Saturday 19/10/19 then every Saturday and Sunday until assessment day 17/11/19. Starts at 8am and finishes 12noon. The course may appear lengthy but our aim is to ensure that all drivers/crew are fully trained to handle all conditions you may experience at sea.

There is also a bit of fat built into the course to allow some time out for life. These courses are fun so book your place at the office if interested.

Our third proficiency happens this Sunday, 20/20/19 commencing at 8am Qld time.

IRB STUFF.

We finally received our new Generation 3 Thundercat IRB and we are quite happy with it. It is larger than the Generation 2 model and not near as flighty to drive. This brings our rescue boat fleet to 4 boats and 4 motors, all fully operational.

We are hoping to have a new and easier to operate motor flush out tank made soon so watch this space. The IRB room is now the Patrol Shed with everything in place there. Two boats are now stored overhead with two ready to go on trailers. The power winch has also been installed in the Patrol Shed for lifting motors on and off the boat.

Please keep in mind that when using the Class 1 boats (Achilles, Gen 2, Gen3 Thundercat) that the craft are to be put onto the sand and the trailer taken back to the shed. Only the Class 3 boat (cat hull) can remain on the trailer on the beach. This is an SLSA requirement, not a local one
