Hello again everyone, time for another grape-vine report.

Well, the training team have been back in action, having completed the annual September holiday SRC and Bronze course. Ten candidates attended, 5 SRC and 5 Bronze, all breezing through successfully. With that out of the way we then commenced an IRB Crew/ Driver course on the 23rd October. No drivers unfortunately but 3 very enthusiastic crew candidates who are enjoying the course immensely. Assessment day for this course is the 27/11. We were hoping to bring this day forward in the scheduling, however due to Rugby on the Beach (30 and 31st October) and Skills Maintenance 21/11/21, we have lost three training days so the assessment will be as scheduled so as the candidates can gain the necessary boat time and experience.

We successfully completed our 2nd Skills Maintenance day on the 17/10/21 with 69 people attending (only 40 pre-booked). Many thanks to Grant, Rod, Chris, Geoff, Jy and Amanda for getting into the practical and paperwork side of presenting this day. It went off pretty well. Our next Skills Maintenance day is Sunday 21/11/21. 7.30 for an 8am start.

We would like to schedule an SSV/Tractor course for Sunday 14/11/21 commencing 9am. If interested please book with the Club so as the necessary paper resources can be sorted. There is no on line stuff for this course so if interested book as soon as possible please.

We will also be running an SRC/Bronze Intense Training course commencing 11/12/21 with assessment day on the 17/12/21. Interested parties will need to book into this course so contact the club office if unsure of what you All theory must be done on need to do. line and a completion certificate presented to the office or the trainers before or on the day the course commences. Pool swim times must also be presented to the Club or Trainers before or on the day of commencement. Failure to do this will result in exclusion from the course. Anyone wishing to attend must commit to attend every day of the course, including assessment day. Should you be unable to do this it is suggested that you attend another course next year. The course will start at 8am Qld time and finish at 1pm, depending on the skill set of the group. Amanda and I will be conducting the training for this course.



IRB STUFF.

As stated earlier, we are currently running an IRB Driver/Crew course which will be assessed on the 27/11/21. John Manning has been selected as the head trainer for this course and he is supported by Chris Van Dorn, Jy and myself.

All four outboard motors have just been serviced and are ready to go. The motor with the faulty kill switch has been fixed with a replacement switch, while Motor No5 had to have the Carburetor replaced as it had seized up at the butterfly throttle valve, making the throttle valve shaft rotate through the carb body and not allowing it to function properly..

The wheelie bin flush tank is working well so please continue to use this method. No rabbit ears or other methods to be used please.

Our new Thundercat Gen3 IRB is due for delivery in the next couple of weeks while a new Outboard Motor is also in the works.

Please continue to use the boats to gain experience, especially our newer drivers and crew and look after them. Officer Manager Grant has a fault reporting App which he is going to make available to all which makes it very easy to report any fault with equipment on line, resulting in speedy rectification of any problems. Please use this App to report any problems with the boats as the fault is very quickly relayed to me. The App is not just for the boats, but for all equipment.

Whilst the ongoing covid restrictions have given pause to a start date for Stage 3 extensions all design and approvals are now complete to enable construction to commence. Our builder Hutchinsons are prepared to start building early in the new year and if things start to return to normal and we have a successful Christmas trading period this could be achievable.

I'm happy to advise that the rear garden has come off its maintenance period and is now the responsibility of the council. At the council's request the club has agreed to continue to provide some maintenance as the garden does enhance the rear appearance of our building.

A permanent shade sail structure is currently being manufactured for installation along the entrance to the training centre and office. The sail will extend to our lease line which is approx 3.3m from the fascia of the deck. The sail will provide a protected seating area for members as well as a set up area for BBQs. Importantly the sail will be a cantilever with no posts to avoid targets being offered to the maneuvering of trailers and equipment. Installation of the shade sail is estimated for early December.

Once again Dulux Paints have come to the party in providing the paint for the extensions. We are very appreciative for this donation which is worth thousands of dollars.

I, like everyone else look forward to a normal 2022 and the completion of our 3rd and final stage of the redevelopment of our club.

WORKING WITH CHILDREN REQUIREMENTS

To this end, there are some changes to the required training for members who hold Blue Cards and participate in any of the following activities.

Please note the required date for completion is the <u>31st of October 2021</u>.

Those who completed the Surfguarding Award have had their award name changed to Child Safe Awareness (as such they don't have to redo the award).
