FROM THE IRB AND TRAINING ROOMS

Hello everyone and welcome to the first Training/IRB report for 2022. We were hoping for an improvement in things for this year, however with so many people catching COVID and having to isolate, it is having a major effect on patrol attendance amongst many other things, so we will just have to battle on through it and do the best we can.

Fortunately the training team had no training courses scheduled during January so we have not been effected yet. Our first training course for the year will be an IRB Driver/Crew course, commencing on Saturday 5/2/22, then every Saturday and Sunday until assessment day on the 12th March. Start time 8am to 1pm.

As usual, our courses appear long, however this ensures that trainees experience as much boat time as possible and in various sea and weather conditions. Craft experience is the most important part of the course, both for your safety and that of the crew and we have a wealth of very experienced Trainers to get you through. So if interested please register at the office. Trainee drivers must have a marine licence so as to train. The club will reimburse trainees for the cost of the training (not the Jet Ski component) provided they commit to doing Patrols. Candidates must pay for the licence (least costly part).

Please contact the office for details on how to obtain a marine licence if unsure.

These courses are lots of fun so register and have a go.

We have not scheduled any other training courses at the moment, we will set a Calendar when we see how things develop.

Just recently, club member and Paramedic Garth McMillan posted an informative video on the operation of the "Halo Oxygen Cylinder" hope everyone got the idea as to the changes in this unit compared to the old Oxygen Tanks.

Points to remember, only proficient ART (advanced resuscitation techniques) members are permitted to use Oxygen Equipment now. This module was removed from the SRC and Bronze courses, who were at one time permitted to apply oxygen therapy only

Also, for those applying Oxygen for any reason, this has to be reported to Surfcom and an ambulance requested.

The patient may refuse ambulance treatment or transport, however we still have to activate this sequence of events.

This is SLSQ regulations

Speaking of Ambulance, trying to get one to attend an emergency on patrol is like winning lotto at the moment.

My last Patrol required QAS attendance, but due to the delay we overcome the problem and subsequently cancelled the ambulance. Very worrying.

IRB STUFF.

Not much to report here. Having a few problems with the butterfly choke valve seizing up due to the humidity and the occasional flooding but nothing else has been reported.

All craft are operational, with 5 boats to choose from along with 4 motors.

Drivers/Crew, get out in the craft and continue to develop your skills, you never know when you might be tested

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


















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
